### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Built in 1964 as one of the College's original buildings, the Leesburg Campus Library is in significant need of renovation – many key systems including roofing and HVAC are damaged beyond repair. In addition, the renovation provides an opportunity for additional renovation to further meet the needs of the student and community populations served. The scope of this project includes a full roof replacement, structural repairs, HVAC replacement, electrical upgrade, and a complete interior renovation to modern standards and current building codes.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Through the utilization of technology and hands-on experiences, the Library becomes an extension of the classroom to reinforce key concepts and foster collaboration. The new Library & Learning Success Center will offer flexible learning spaces and have librarians, tutors, and academic support staff available to students all in one location.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The renovated space will offer new community event spaces and library services to the public. In addition, academic support services and resources, including tutoring and proctored testing will be available to the institution's students and the public.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Prior to the pandemic, the Library was serving over 2,000 students each week. LSSC expects this number to double after the renovation and improvement project. The flexible layout of the main Library area should also allow for campus and community events of up to 150 people.

Through the utilization of technology and hands-on experiences, the Library becomes an extension of the classroom to reinforce key concepts and foster collaboration.
