Funds were used to fund summer programs, technology for distance learning, custodial supplies, PPE and fogging equipment and offset loss of medicaid revenue.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose is to grow the Lake County Schools Aviation Academy thus increasing enrollment opportunities for students across the district. The Aviation Academy will prepare students for high-skilled, high-demand, high-wage jobs to meet the job outlook expected growth for Florida aerospace/aviation employment. This appropriation would create state-of-the-art facilities equipped with the latest technologies and equipment, making premier sites for students to train for aviation careers. The programs provide a productive place where students can excel by earning industry certifications and post-secondary credits.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Maintain Current Year Programs

A. East Ridge HS- USI Curriculum and certification testing for VSO-Ground & VSO-Air

B. Eustis HS- Embry Riddle Courses and certification testing for UAS Safety Certificate

C. South Lake HS - Embry Riddle Dual-enrollment Courses and certification testing for Private Pilot Ground; purchase of flight simulator and 2 computers for content/skill application.

2. The following would be added:

A. Lake Minneola HS- Embry Riddle Dual-enrollment Courses and certification testing for Private Pilot Ground; purchase of flight simulator, ancillary equipment, classroom equipment, software and 31 computers for content/skill application.

B. Leesburg HS - USI Curriculum and certification testing for UAS Safety Certificate and Private Pilot Ground; purchase of flight simulator, ancillary equipment, classroom equipment, software and 31 computers for content/skill application.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Aviation Academy addresses Florida's growing demand for high-skilled labor in the aerospace/aviation industry as our population and economy grow, supplying the state with a skilled, prepared workforce addressing job outlook growth. Florida aerospace/aviation employment increased 40% through 2019 (Florida Department of Economic Opportunity, 2019). Lake County is uniquely situated in Central Florida and is rapidly growing in population and economy. Lake County has the support of our local aviation business/industry and related business leaders who are committed to the Aviation Academy success.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All Lake County High School students who wish to enroll in the Aviation Academy are eligible. Currently, between the three high schools with programs in the Aviation academy, there are 200 students enrolled. By expanding, the students expected to be served may increase to 500. This program is especially tailored to increase STEM learning opportunities and to expose students to careers in the aviation field. Both male and female students are encouraged to enroll in this program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will allow the Aviation Academy to create the future workforce for Central Florida and Lake County aviation industry. Participating students will graduate ready to fill high-demand jobs and/or may continue with their postsecondary education to become airline/commercial pilots. Airline/Commercial Pilot job outlook expected to see a 13% increase 2020-2030 (USBLS, 2020). Providing skilled workers to fill the labor gaps may attract more business to our state thus allowing businesses to grow and generate more revenue. In addition, students will leave the academy with the skills to obtain high-wage jobs insuring their financial outlook. Florida ranks 5th in the nation for airline/commercial pilot salaries (USBLS, 2020).
