12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This capital construction project will enable Phoenix House Florida to treat patients struggling with mental illness and drug addiction uninterrupted during the COVID-19 pandemic or any other epidemiological outbreak, such as influenza. Only 52% of the Marion County population is vaccinated against COVID-19, and the population in which we serve are the highest likely to not be vaccinated. This expansion project is critical to enabling Phoenix House Florida to continue treating our patients in a safe and compliant manner. The facility will also include bathrooms, a laundry facility, common residential lounge and kitchenette, staff lounge, staff kitchen, staff bathroom, and janitorial storage.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Phoenix House will be able to treat more patients struggling with addiction during this COVID-19 pandemic environment. More patients will be able to receive medication-assisted treatment, assessment, therapy, and case management providing access to care for patients suffering from substance use disorders (SUD). This facility will provide patients vital access to a continuum of care, mental health and substance abuse, peer support, supportive housing, and resources to the community and criminal justice system.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This capital project will better enable our organization to treat more patients as we continue to follow all healthcare regulations enacted by the CDC and the State Department of Health. More than 90% of people struggling with addiction do not receive treatment and when treatment facilities are restricted due to important health regulations, the challenge for patients to obtain the treatment they desperately need becomes even greater. This issue with capacity, combined with the unprecedented increase in opioid overdoses across the state of Florida needs support more than ever.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes individuals with poor mental health who struggle with substance use disorders (SUD). These individuals are often in poor physical health, economically disadvantaged, at-risk for homelessness or formerly incarcerated, and victims or criminal offenders.

The expected benefits of this capital project is to enable Phoenix House Florida to continue serving patients regardless of current or future social-distancing and quarantine regulations imposed by public health officials.
