The activities will include the replacement/repair of culverts and/or outfalls and restoration/stabilization of canal banks

About 32,000 people living in the city will be served as the project scope includes citywide drainage outfalls and canal bank restoration/stabilization and related water quality improvements.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

- 1. Public Safety improvement by stabilizaing the canal banks
- 2. Surface Water Quality improvements by improving culvers/outfalls and canal bank stabilization/restoration
- 3. Elimination of the loss of property by stopping canal bank erosion
- 4. Improvements of the canal bank aesthetic beauty by enhancing canal bank stabilization with greenwise environment friendly technology
- 5. Drainage improvements by improving the culvets connecting canals.
