North Bay Village is requesting \$150,000 to support the Stormwater Inlet Filter Installation Project. Stormwater inlet filters are a Best Management Practice (BMP) to reduce stormwater management costs, prevent pollution, and prevent flooding caused by debris and pollution in stormwater pipes and systems. The proposed project installs upward flow custom stormwater drainage filters on existing storm inlets throughout the Village. The result of this project will be reduced debris entering the stormwater treatment train, which leads to cleaner and greater volumes of water flow and reduced flood risk and duration of floods.
