CARES Act Funds - \$2,485,816 - body temp kiosks, sneeze guards, ambulance, COVID testing machines and kits, message boards, cleaning supplies and public health and safety employee salaries

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of this project is to fulfill the 25% match of the NRCS funds awarded to clean up several creeks, streams and ditches causing hindrances in the flow and backup of water onto private residences.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Cleaning and debris removal will be completed by contractors and in-house operations to restore natural water flow to selected creeks, streams and ditches. These funds will help fulfill the 25% match of the NRCS project.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Residents along the proposed sites, as well as the upstream and downstream areas of these sites, will have a less chance to be flooded due to hindrances in the flow and backup of water. Roadway maintenance in these areas will be reduced due to less flooding. Citizen will be less likely to encounter a flooded roadway in these areas.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Many citizens of Calhoun County will be served by this project. Residents along the proposed sites, as well as the upstream and downstream areas of these sites, will have a less chance to be flooded. All citizens and visitors that travel the roadways in these areas will also be served. Since some of these projects are on high traffic roads, the impact will be very large.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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The benefits of this project will be less flooding and restoration to natural water flow. This could be measured by the reduction of flood insurance claims, roadway flooding documentation from the County Road Department, etc.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The County will work with the contracting agency to determine applicable measures should funding be made available.

The Calhoun County Board of County Commissioners will receive funding and oversee the cleanup. Removing the debris from these creeks, streams and ditches will be completed by both force account labor provided by Calhoun County personnel and contractors experienced in removing and monitoring debris removal from waterways.
