These funds were used for COVID-19 enhanced sanitation efforts, to improve distance learning technologies and remote work technologies, to conduct additional class sections as the number of students permitted in a classroom was diminished due to social distancing protocols, enhanced safety and security features, and to offset revenue loss.

The CFK Academy Classroom Facility and EOC building will be constructed and the charter school will enroll up to 200 students. The charter school will maximize dual enrollment opportunities for students in the College's Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) courses and Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. In addition, the facility will serve as the College's EOC.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The facility will house a charter school for grades 9-12. The charter school will maximize dual enrollment opportunities for students in the College's Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) courses and Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. In addition, the facility will serve as the College's EOC.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The facility will house a charter school for grades 9-12. The charter school will maximize dual enrollment opportunities for students in the College's Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) courses and Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are high school students. Up to 200 students in grades 9-12 will be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

At least 50% of the students will successfully earn postsecondary credits, postsecondary certifications, industry certifications, and/or associate degrees, while enrolled at the CFK Academy. The methodology to be used is the actual percentage of students enrolled at the CFK Academy earning postsecondary credits, postsecondary certifications, industry certifications, and/or associate degrees.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the project is not completed in three years, funds revert back to the state.
