The Woodson Museum is highly regarded for promoting, exploring, preserving, presenting, and celebrating African American history. The Woodson's popularity has propelled its purpose and programming to exceed its current 4,000 sq. ft. facility. The City of St. Petersburg has gifted the Woodson 5.5 acres to construct Florida's first purpose-built African American Museum. #### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds aid in the construction of a new museum, appropriate in design and size to the rapidly scaling mission of the Woodson which has expanded beyond the limits of today's location. The new location will allow for expanded exhibitions, new exhibits, and presentations. The new museum includes a library/justice center providing opportunities for research on African American history and culture – local, state, and national. The museum would have adequate space to host lecture series featuring untold history regarding African American contributions to the nation's history. The expanded space lends itself to stronger partnerships with schools and universities broadening curricula and opportunities for area scholars to attain academic excellence. New and expanded exhibitions will promote tourism. The creation of Florida's first properly constructed African American Museum will generate tourism and help to revitalize a historic community.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



The new location will allow for expanded exhibitions, new exhibits, and presentations. The new museum includes a library/justice center providing opportunities for research on African American history and culture – local, state, and national. The museum would have adequate space to host lecture series for citizens to learn more about the untold history regarding African American contributions to the nation's history. The expanded space lends itself to stronger partnerships with schools and universities broadening curricula and opportunities for area scholars to attain academic excellence.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The museum will expand its public artifact holdings for future generations and for historical preservation. The museum will partner with public and private schools and community groups to implement educational programming in the classroom to include after-hours activities and programming as well as additional summer camps and activities. The museum will increase general tourism to Deuces Live! Mainstreet district which is being positioned as an historic African American arts district of which the museum is a key leader.

#### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

#### be measured?

The museum will provide a connection to the larger group of world-famous museums which currently make St. Petersburg a cultural destination. A registration system for artifacts will be implemented by the museum and tracked through the addition of artifacts. The number of education programs, community groups, and school children which attend the structured programs will be tracked daily and will be reported on annually. Tourism numbers will be tracked by the museum as well as tours to the African American Heritage Trail which runs through the district in collaboration with museum tours and visits.
