As a result, the City of North Miami Beach will continue to be a safe place to live and conduct business.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The training received at this facility sharpens the skills of the City of North Miami Beach Police Department personnel. Therefore, it creates a robust police department that will maintain its stellar services of protecting the citizens and businesses within the City of North Miami Beach.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All residents within the region and statewide, in partnership with FDLE, expected to target greater than 800 initially.

The expected outcome will be the additional trainings and certifications for officers within the City and availability for new outcomes for officers throughout the region. These can be tracked by usage of the facility as well as certifications and trainings achieved.
