Hanley Foundation is requesting \$1.5 million to help construct an \$8 million, 17,000 sq.ft. Community Recovery Center within the urban corridor of Palm Beach County. The new Community Resource Center will serve as an anchor destination for the recovery community providing space for support meetings, educational events, a recovery-focused bookstore, as well as the headquarters for Hanley Foundation's prevention education work. The Hanley Foundation was founded in 1984 as a nonprofit organization focused on providing scholarships for addiction treatment and groundbreaking substance use prevention programs within public and private schools throughout Florida. Today, the Foundation combats substance use disorders by raising awareness and providing quality prevention education programming in schools and communities in 28 Florida counties, as well as educating medical and other professionals on the front line of the opioid epidemic about the early signals and symptoms of addiction.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Hanley Foundation is requesting \$1.5 million to help construct an \$8 million, 17,000 sq.ft. Community Recovery Center within the urban corridor of Palm Beach County. The new Community Resource Center will serve as an anchor destination for the recovery community providing space for support meetings, educational events, a recovery-focused bookstore, as well as the headquarters for Hanley Foundation's prevention education work.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Hanley Foundation is focused on filling a void that led to Palm Beach County being declared the "epicenter" of the opiate epidemic. A strong recovery community within Palm Beach County will help to support individuals in recovery by providing access to meetings, programs, and services, as well as opportunities to get to know like-minded people in recovery. This access point will be the new Hanley Foundation Recovery Community Center.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The new Community Resource Center will serve as an anchor destination for the recovery community providing space for support meetings, educational events, a recovery-focused bookstore, as well as the headquarters for Hanley Foundation's prevention education work.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Jobless persons, Economically disadvantaged persons, At-risk youth Homeless, Drug users (in health services), Grade school students, High school students, University/College students, Currently or formerly incarcerated persons, Drug offenders (in criminal Justice), Victims of crime.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

Programming will reduce the number of individuals diagnosed with substance use disorder, a leading cause of accidental death, hospitalization, and illness statewide. Evaluation of drug usage, drug-related death/illness for Palm Beach County and surrounding areas, as provided annually by FDOH. The building will provide space to house programs, groups, and community-based meetings. The number of individuals and families engaged in support services offered by the agency will ensure that needs are being addressed. Evidence-based prevention education for middle and high school students will seek to reduce first age of use in terms of alcohol, marijuana, and other substances. Students will show proficiency in understanding of the harmful effects of alcohol, marijuana, and other substances, therefore delaying (or eliminating) potential usage. Individuals entering recovery will be connected to vocational training to re-enter the workforce. Number of individuals participating in programming.

A return of 100% of the funds received from contracting agency.
