Due to the widening of US 319 through Crawfordville, the county must relocate their government facilities. Funds to be used to seek contractual services to conduct project development and architectural/engineering design for a new government complex that will be located on the county-owned community center property. Currently, county services are in various locations in older buildings and the new facility will house county departments and constitutional offices. Providing a consolidated government complex will provide for ease of accessibility to the public, efficiency of services, and a reduction of costs to tax payers. a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds to be used to seek contractual services to conduct project development and architectural/engineering design for a new county government complex to be located on the county-owned community center property. The widening of US 319 through Crawfordville requires the county facilities to relocate.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities are to seek contractual project development architectural/engineering design services through the county's procurement process for a government complex facility that will provide accessibility and consolidation of county services into one complex. The selected vendor will provide final design/construction-ready plans.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services to citizens will provide for ease of accessibility to conduct business in one location and savings for tax payers due to reduction of costs for consolidation of services to one complex. The new complex will house county departments and constitutional offices for but not limited to: Board of County Commissioners, Administration, Building Department, Planning and Community Development, Veterans Services, Code Enforcement, and Tourist Development Council.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Once constructed, the new facility will serve Wakulla County residents, visitors, and the business community. Greater than 37,000 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



Completion of the architectural/engineering design services allows the project to be shovel ready and move forward with permitting, bidding, contractor selection, and construction as designed. Employment maintained from project in this rural area of opportunity. Once constructed, consolidation of county services into one complex provides efficiency and savings to tax payers.
