12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project will enhance safety and access along Channelside Drive from Kennedy Blvd. to Nuccio Pkwy. Multi-modal improvements were recently completed south of this section, providing connections to the Port, Water Street, and the Central Business District. Intersection improvements, providing enhanced multi-modal access, will be a part of this project. This corridor has been identified by the City of Tampa as a critical corridor in need of safety improvements, specifically for pedestrians. This corridor is within the Channelside Community Redevelopment Area and was identified in the CRA's Strategic Action Plan.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project includes enhanced crossings, a signalized intersection, and new sidewalks and trails.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

It will provide safety and multi-modal benefits by improving walkability, pedestrian access, and ADA compliance.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

General population including residents, workers, and customers.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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- 1) Reduce congestion by providing safe multi-modal alternatives to roadways and parking facilities that are at or near capacity (measured by traffic studies).
