This project has been included in the City of Tampa's Walk Bike Plan that was developed jointly with the Hillsborough MPO. The need for the improvements was identified in a preliminary transportation plan prepared by Stantec. The goal is to connect neighborhoods to cultural and employment centers, which will increase economic activity and growth.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project includes enhanced crossings, a signalized intersection, and new sidewalks and trails.

It will provide safety and multi-modal benefits by improving walkability, pedestrian access, and ADA compliance.

General population including residents, workers, and customers.
