a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

C2C provides pathways for college students and recent graduates from rural, low-income, and disadvantaged communities to intern with members of the Executive and Legislative branch to launch their careers in public service. We aim to create 20 scholarships specifically for Florida college students to provide leadership training, professional development, mentorship, internship placement, intern housing, meals, transportation, and other costs relating to interning in Tallahassee, Florida.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

C2C will provide pathway scholarship to 20 college students and recent graduates from rural, low-income, and disadvantaged communities to intern in Florida's legislative process C2C will recruit, work with Executive and Legislative leaders to discuss placement, and provide adequate resources for students to launch their career in public service.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Leadership training, professional development, mentorship, internship placement, intern housing, meals, transportation, and other costs related to interning in Florida's legislative process in Tallahassee.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Twenty (20) low-income, diverse college students & recent graduates attending Florida colleges and universities.

Our goal is to secure Executive & Legislative branch internships for low income and diverse college students. Students who intern are 68% more likely to receive a paid full-time job. 90% of our alumni are currently working in public service, thanks to their internship. C2C tracks the students' internships and post-internship careers, as well as their socioeconomic status.
