12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

- 1. Community Integrated Employment (CIE) will provide 127 students & postgraduates functional education, workforce readiness training that includes early employment opportunities, & relevant social skills. The program will increase the likelihood of obtaining compensated employment within two years of graduation. The Director of Transition & Postgraduates will track graduate progress yearly & collect data on program enrollment, employment, work retention, & independent living status to inform program improvement & assess impact.
- 2. Equip each family & their students with information, resources, & services to prepare for post graduation life. Progress will be tracked through parent/student/teacher/job-coach collaborative conferences & participation in information & planning sessions.
- 3. NFSSE will engage with existing community businesses & recruit at least 4 new partners to increase capacity, provide a range of experiences, & establish employment pipeline opportunities.
- b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Fifty, transition students will receive academic and vocational skills training 3 days per week and supported on-the-job training 2 days per week.

Seventy-seven, postgraduate students will receive vocational training that continues to focus on work readiness skills, work experiences, self-advocacy, social skills training and compensated employment.

Families and their children with intellectual disabilities will gain knowledge and expertise with accessing available resources. NFSSE will provide a resource guide and Independent Living Checklist families may use to self-assess.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Fifty, transition students will receive academic and vocational skills training 3 days per week and supported on-the-job training 2 days per week.

Seventy-seven, postgraduate students will receive vocational training that continues to focus on work readiness skills, work experiences, self-advocacy, social skills training and compensated employment.

NFSSE will provide "Lunch and Learn" training sessions to a minimum of 1 business partner per month to increase their understanding regarding abilities of individuals with intellectual disabilities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are students and postgraduates at NFSSE. These are 127 individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The NFSSE Community Integrated Employment (CIE) Program will serve 127 young adults with intellectual disabilities during the 2022-2023 school year. The program will prepare both families and students for post-school lives that can include stable, compensated employment, a self-sufficient lifestyle, and independent living with on-going, stable assistance when necessary.

Student Impact: Students learn most effectively when taught skills within the context in which they will be used. CIE Program participants will be more likely to obtain compensated employment within two years of graduation as a result of hands-on work experiences in NFSSE micro-enterprises, volunteer placements with business partners, and training in social skills and self-advocacy.
