#### 12. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The project will enhance water quality in the St. Lucie River and Estuary by eliminating nutrient loading from 22 septic systems at the rate of 235 lbs Total Phosphorous annually. This project will help to achieve the Total Maximum Daily Load goal and help complete the Basin Management Action Plan as well as compliment the state's Northern Everglades and Estuaries Protection Program. This project is an element of Martin County's 10 year "Connect to Protect" plan to convert 10,000 septic systems in 10 years. In addition the increased wastewater flow will be treated to tertiary levels and conserved for reuse purposes.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construct a sewage force main system to serve approximately 22 commercial properties with centralized sewer service and eliminate on-site septic systems. The county's "Connect to Protect" program has several incentive features built in to encourage voluntary connection to new sewer services. They include early connection discounts, special assessment financing over 20 years, and negotiated bulk pricing for simple and high value lateral line connection options.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will provide centralized sewer services to 22 commercial units.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will serve the Seven J's Industrial area with approximately 100 persons.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The 22 commercial properties will benefit from removal of septic systems as well as the general public by enhanced water quality in the St. Lucie River and Indian River Lagoon. There will be continued groundwater and surface water testing to support the desired outcome of the project. The county will work with the FDEP to establish a Quality Assurance Plan to ensure the effectiveness of the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the project is not completed, funds to be reverted back to FDEP.
