1. Project Title Habitat for Humanity at Citrus Springs

4. Project/Program Description

Construction of 183 unit single family homeownership development specifically to serve asset limited/income constrained households earning less than than 80% area medium income. Construct 3 and 4 bedroom energy efficient homes on sites served by public sewer and water with engineered storm water drainage, paved streets, sidewalks, and street lighting. Although not limited to, the focus is to provide affordable housing for the workforce in western Marion, south Levy, and Citrus counties. The project is strategically located to allow reasonable drive times for work, shopping, and health care. Adequate school capacity exists along with plenty of recreational opportunities. The project will be developed in two phases, the first being 100 lots with the infrastructure nearly complete. Presently, 29 families have qualified for the program and more will be on-boarded starting January 2022. Habitat for Humanity of Citrus County, Inc., currently owns the 183 individual lots.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To supplement HFHCC's existing resources needed to develop 183 single family home sites ready for home construction.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Will seek local families with a demonstrated need for affordable housing and based on income with emphasis on the workforce. Currently this population segment is rent burdened based on cost and in too many instances sub-standard conditions. Outcomes will include safer and healthier environment, workforce retention, and enhanced academic performance. Increase public tax revenue from property taxes, utility service fees, and on average \$7,000 annual increase per family housing cost savings. 183 x \$7,000 totaling \$1,281,000 annual local economic boost plus another \$330,000 per year local direct revenue.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Decent affordable homeownership and potential wealth accumulation. Pride. Dignity. Security.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



Households with limited assets and income less than 80% area medium as determined by HUD. All qualified families will be served in accordance with applicable laws; however, special emphasis will be placed on the workforce in the above stated service area. Based on HFHCC historical average household size the estimated individuals served will be 394. This may increase somewhat due to a greater mix of families with children.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The benefit(s) will be measured by the quality of life for families including enhanced financial capacity, security, and wealth building. The methodology is simple in this case - simple comparisons can be made by market rate housing costs including rentals vs fixed homeownership costs realized from the project.

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
