a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Preserving and enhancing the rural quality of life within this agricultural/equestrian community is an integral part of the town's comp plan. Construction of the North Road Equestrian/Multi-Use Trail will improve connectivity between the public greenways/trails within the town and protect, preserve, and improve the overall natural environment and tree canopy. Connectivity is needed (town has no sidewalks) and North Trail directly connects with Palm Beach Pines Natural Area that PBC manages. PBC has provided newly constructed equestrian access on the north side for this North Trail.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All citizens within this rural agricultural/equestrian community, that is targeted at 3,200 residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Safe access to equestrian and multi-use trails will be provided to the public within PBC. Access to environmental preserve and recreational access in an agricultural/equestrian community. Recreational access and exercise has been shown to improve quality of life outcomes; this project will provide enhancement of environmental and natural preserve areas and recreational access.

Liquidated damages will be included in contracts by the Town of Loxahatchee Groves for failure to meet deliverables or performance measures stated to contractors.
