In FY 2020-2021 the Academy at Glengary received \$114,200 in PPP funding to cover payroll costs from April–June 2020, with 100% of the loan amount forgiven. An additional \$20,048 in Sarasota County CARES funds were used to purchase PPE for weekly fogging (sanitation) services and Plexiglas dividers in the Arts, Communications, reception and common training areas.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Clients of the Academy at Glengary's Manatee campus will be provided with hands-on skills training to include proficiency in the use of PC's and Macs, Microsoft Office Suite, Adobe Creative Suite, Flourish database, information technologies, digital content, data management and analysis, virtual platforms and electronic/mobile devices.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Adults living with severe and persistent mental illness (SPMI) often lack technical and digital literacy skills required by many businesses of their employees. By implementing a robust technology training program designed to teach a wide range of tech skills, the Academy members will be equipped with the skills to acquire employment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Technical and digital literacy training will be provided to Manatee County residents identified as chronically unemployed, economically disadvantaged and diagnosed with serious mental illnesses. Vocational training will be provided on-site at the Academy at Glengary's Manatee campus, Monday - Friday, 8am - 4pm as part of its services as an accredited Mental Health Clubhouse program.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Up to 200 adult citizens/year identified as chronically unemployed, economically disadvantaged and diagnosed with severe and persistent mental illnesses living in Manatee County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

Success factors include: completion of technical vocational training, acquisition of digital literacy skills, attainment of employment (Transitional and/or Supported Employment), and tenure on the job.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Unspent funds would be returned to the State.
