12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The establishment of "grow your own" primary care residents to fill needed shortages at primary care provider slots such as FQHCs. Federal data, from the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA), indicates that providers that complete residencies in the primary care setting tend to stay in primary care once their residency is completed. This "grow your own" tool is an excellent recruitment tool to help Community Health Centers further provide healthcare for Florida's most vulnerable populations. Accordingly, this funding will help with the planning and design for building world-class Community Academic Health Centers that provide residency programs for primary care providers.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

With funding, FACHC will create a first-of-its-kind 'playbook' that describes all aspects related to the launch, operations, and sustainability of a Community Academic Health Center within FQHCs, with the specific focus on primary care in order to retain providers that are trained in Florida for long-term careers. Funding is necessary to support planning using evidence, leveraging best practices, and creating programming for a Community Academic Health Center that is relevant to the needs of the state and provides benefit to providers. The planning will include support for the accreditation process, building sustainable financial models, integrating recruitment strategies, and defining partnerships leading to the launch of two centers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Funding for this project is necessary to ensure proper planning and design work associated with providing healthcare for the state's most vulnerable populations, including the uninsured and under-insured (which is at the core of FQHCs' mission). As a result of this funding and the completion of this project, and with secured funding, the launch of two Community Academic Health Centers can commence which will positively impact patient populations.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The planning portion of this work will include a targeted population of medical schools, hospitals, and community-based partners that collaboratively engage with FQHCs to create two Community Academic Health Centers.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Florida lacks in our ability to provide primary care residency programs. It is an area of great concern as provider shortages ramp up in geometric proportion. While we provide medical school training in 10 schools, most have nowhere to go for primary care residencies in state. FQHCs provide a setting where residents do tend to remain in primary care within the state once they complete their residency training. This project will be measured on the ROI of number of patients seen by these providers and, where data are available, any cost savings to the State. Expectations for long-term impacts is up to 25 residency placements within the centers, supporting up to 500 patients per year per resident based on standard workload calculations.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Penalty for not completing deliverables is the inability to launch the two Community Academic Health Centers referenced in this proposal.
