### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds would cover the building expansion with the addition of 4,000 square feet that would be divided into improvements for the resale store (a revenue generating enterprise), addition of a culinary kitchen (skills-based learning, future revenue generation, community usage for events), skills laboratory (educational and enterprise opportunities), completion of the Outdoor Experience Center.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This funding would provide not only sustainability, but expansion of current programs and services. By providing more skills-based learning, this will provide a wide network for young adults transiting from county educational program to encourage participation with our programs. This funding will be vital to expansion of services for not only adults, but in the future children and seniors. The Outdoor Experience Center promotes health and wellness with opportunities for the whole family to enjoy the facilities furthering the message of community inclusion.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Direct services offered to the targeted demographic will feature expansion to incorporate more skills-based learning that would provide a series of micro enterprises that would help to generate revenue for The Arc. Life Skills Development and Nassau Works (our in house entity that provides employment opportunities to the I/DD community) would have the resources necessary to train our individuals with skills that they could take into the community to enter into sustained employment opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The current population targeted are adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. We are currently serving approximately 60 individuals. Each year the Nassau County school system transitions 40 students from their system and looks for opportunities such as The Arc to act a bridge for these students to pass them to adulthood. By strengthening and expansion of programming it is more feasible that we could secure placements for young adults leaving the Transitioning Adult Program (TAP). As far as community inclusion, the public is welcome to visit our Outdoor Experience Center and volunteer. Our building is also home to several other non-profits who meet weekly, those entities include the Vietnam Veterans Association, North Florida Autism Advocates, Boy Scouts of America, Amelia Cruizers, and Fraternal Order of the Police.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome for this expansion would be bringing a new generation of participants to our programs and services. By expanding our space, we are able to expand programs and diversify programming to eventually include children and seniors. Our programs and services enrich the participants life through the building of skills, community inclusion and ultimately finding sustaining employment. With the end resolve being placing individuals in meaningful employment relationships, it will lift the burden for governmental assistance programs.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If at anytime we are not fulfilling our contractual agreement, we will cease and return unused proceeds back to the state.
