### 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will help expand access to care and grant us the ability to better serve the community by providing a full continuum of care at one location. Collocating our Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU) and Detox programs will relieve the over-utilization of county resources, resulting in a reduced burden to the tax payers. The project will help support our "No Wrong Door" philosophy by providing crisis triage, assessment, and 24-hour access to services.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Once the project is completed, there will be one centralized location for crisis support and substance abuse/detox services. This location will provide 24/7 services for anyone with substance or mental health problems.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

One centralized location for mental health crisis and substance abuse detox services. This will allow us to fully utilize a 24/7 Access Center to assess citizens in crisis and ensure they receive the proper treatment needed.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Individuals who suffer from mental health and substance abuse disorders. Individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis. We anticipate to serve 2,500 individuals per year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
