12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The new building will be used for the Pace Center and Reach Program in Citrus County that operates 250 days per year and serves girls at risk of juvenile justice system involvement in FY 22-23. Currently Pace Citrus and the Reach Program are operated out of a building rented from the Citrus County Public Schools, and intended as a temporary location. The new facility will include a safe location for classrooms, counseling, a Reach office and other school safety features. The goal of the Pace program is for all girls to lead productive, engaged and fulfilling lives.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The building will be used to serve approximately 178 girls annually who are at risk of juvenile justice system involvement. Girls receive wrap around social services such as therapy, counseling and life skills. Girls in the Pace Center also receive their full academic school day. Services are provided in a trauma-informed, gender-responsive and strength-based environment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The building will house a Pace Center and central operations for Pace Reach, providing comprehensive wrap around social services and the full academic school day to approximately 94 girls at risk of delinquency through our Pace Center

comprehensive wrap around social services to an additional 84 girls annually through Pace Reach. Case management for the girl's family is also provided to ensure a stable home environment.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Pace will serve approximately 178 middle and high school age girls at risk for juvenile justice system involvement and dropping out of school. The girls' families benefit from Pace both indirectly and through family engagement, home visits and counseling. The general public also benefits through increased public safety.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Funding will provide a safe space for Pace girls to receive comprehensive wrap around social services and their full academic school day. Short term outcomes for girls include 1) maintaining attendance and advancing grade levels 2) demonstrated increase in self-efficacy and pro-social coping skills; and 3) reduction in risky behaviors. Long term outcomes include 1) high school graduation and enrollment in post-secondary education or the workforce; 2) obtaining employment; 3) no involvement in the criminal justice system; and 4) decreased economic dependency. Pace Center utilizes a combination of output data and outcome data to measure outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

All Pace contracts with DJJ outline penalties for failing to meet deliverables. DJJ may reduce payments to Pace if sufficient evidence shows that deliverables were not met.

The building will be the property of the Pace Center for Girls.
