12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal is to deliver safe housing, employment, education, life skills, accountability, and trauma therapy so that broken individuals have the tools to heal and change their lives.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Psych/social evaluation, specific independent living plan (ILP) goal for each individual, employment coaching and placement, educational support, life skills and coaching, and trauma therapy.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Safe house to live in, trauma therapy, life skills, employment/job readiness, GED/college guidance, accountability, and life coaching.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is the vulnerable in the communities who age out of foster care as they are prime targets for human trafficking, survivors of the sex trade, and individuals who suffer from addictions, homelessness, and mental health.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Provide safe housing ie: zero tolerance for illegal drug activity or violence. 75 current bed space for 18 years of age and up to receive an approximately 7 month program that teaches them to be gainfully employed, including 14-30 days of employment coaching until they are employed. 75 individuals receive life coaching, accountability, and random drug testing and house visits. 75-200 individuals have opportunity to divert from jail time relating to their trauma, ie; sex trafficking, addiction, or theft.
