12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project would extend the City's existing water system further west along US Highway 90 up to Woodberry Road. By doing so, it increases capacity for more than 20 businesses and expansion for future business development along the US Highway 90 corridor. It also creates greater access to fire protection, an ability to expand from 50 homes to 110 residences and decreases the need for private wells on Woodbury Road.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to design and construct of the water line extension.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Currently, the City has a water line along the south side of US Highway 90 that serves more than 20 commercial properties. The new system will provide added water pressure and fire protection to the south side of US Highway 90. The new line will go along the north side of US Highway 90 and serve residents along Woodberry Road with water and fire protection as well as existing businesses. Future residential and commercial growth in this area is eminent, therefore, access to a water system critical.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

There are greater than 20 businesses and 50 homes in the proposed project area. An estimated 4,000 people will be served by this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Immediate benefits of this project are the expansion of facilities for a long-time hardware store, wherein they will more than double their daily employees from 15 to 40 staff. The Woodberry Community will immediately have the water capacity to grow from a 50 home community to at least 110 homes without use of private wells. Four fire hydrants will be added and an increase of water pressure needed for the county's largest employer. There will be an immediate improvement in the revenue base for the city. The City will have record of who joins the water system and how much water is used by reading the meters.

The City will work with the contracting agency to determine applicable measures and penalties, should funding be made available.
