Gulf Coast has received \$16,838,559 in federal assistance related to COVID-19. \$6,877,694 has been disbursed directly to students with plans to provide additional student aid, and \$2,927,025 of institutional funds has been used for significant changes to the delivery of instruction due to COVID-19 and to support efforts by the college that strengthen and enhance the capabilities of public health systems to respond effectively to evolving threats and other emergencies.

Land cost per a recent appraisal is \$3,125,000, with the balance of \$15,800 to cover appraisals and a Phase I environmental assessment of the property. 12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Acquire the only remaining parcel of undeveloped property contiguous to the Gulf Coast State College - Panama City Campus. Acquisition of this parcel will provide the only alternative available to a "landlocked" college for any current and future expansion needs. Other than this property, the college is "landlocked" by existing city, state and federal highways, as well as by St. Andrew Bay.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to secure available property adjacent to the college's largest and "landlocked" campus in Panama City. This acquisition will ensure the college's ability to continue to provide high quality, accessible, and cost effective educational opportunities to the citizen's of the most populated county in the college's service district.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Ultimately the acquisition of the adjacent property (available for the first time in over 40 years) will allow for the development of new educational programs and the expansion of existing educational programs to continue to meet the educational needs of the citizens of Bay, Gulf, and Franklin counties, into the foreseeable future.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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The target population to be served includes college and high school students, all community members, the jobless, the economically disadvantaged, the homeless, the physically and developmentally disabled, and all interested in furthering their education. The target population includes all of the citizens of Bay, Gulf and Franklin Counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Acquisition of the subject property will preserve it for future development of college facilities, as needed. With current development in the area, cost to acquire and property availability may severely restrict the college's ability to meet the future needs of the service district. Current college property can only accommodate approximately one additional educational building/with parking.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The penalty for failing to meet the deliverables should be the return of the funding. The request is specific to the acquisition one one identified piece of property. If the college is unable to secure that specific piece of property, the funding appropriated for that use should revert.
