12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of this project is to renovate classrooms to expand services to additional students with special needs. 60 additional students and their families will benefit. Additional support services after graduation will be available through the Regional Autism Training Center. Provide a high-quality education at Hope School that has a "Commendable" rating by the Florida Department of Education.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used for renovation services through a construction company, architectural firm, construction contractors, and vendors providing goods and services. Families from around the country have moved to Jackson County for their students to attend Hope School providing economic stimulation. Completion of these renovations will allow additional students to attend Hope School.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Provide high-quality educational services to an additional 60 students with special needs at Hope School. Prepare students for quality career preparation to transition to Regional Autism Training Center or Jackson County ARC. Provide construction jobs with economic impact to businesses amounting to \$750,000 in goods and services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

60 new students and their families by creating new classrooms for instructional services. 20 new instructional staff to support students and their families. Supporting a pipeline of students to new Regional Autism Training Center and Jackson County ARC with students ready for additional training for career readiness. Having students ready for careers will benefit the 49,000 citizens of Jackson County to build the community.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

The investment of \$1 million will have an immediate \$750,000 impact on the economy with salaries/benefits and economic stimulation of the added 21 jobs anticipated from the project (CCIM, Estimating Economic Impact found at https://www.ccim.com/cire-magazine/articles/estimating-economic-impact/). The annualized Return on Investment for operational cost savings and reduction of duplicated staff is \$396,066.68. This accounts for operational costs of school buildings to be vacated, administrative staff, and maintenance staff. Calculations conducted internally by Finance Department.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

No additional penalties outside of the standard AIA contract.
