b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds will be used to construct a facility to house the City's Fire and Police Departments. The City of Williston Fire Rescue Department is responsible for responding to all types of fire, vehicle accidents, medical calls, alarms, hazardous materials incidents, technical rescues, and other incidents within the 6.75 square miles of the City of Williston along with a contracted response district totaling roughly 128 square miles within Levy County. In addition, we are also second due to respond when no units are available for Levy County Fire Rescue District 11 and Bronson Fire Rescue which adds an additional 220 square miles of coverage.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The services that will be be provided by this facility will allow for fire and life safety, education, prevention and training activities; a safe place for victims of crimes; youth education and training opportunities for both employees and the community along with providing programs such as "A Safe Haven" for newborns, "A Safe Place" for adeolescents; and, fire and police mentoring programs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



Elderly, Persons with poor mental and physical health, economically disadvantaged persons, At-risk youth, homeless, developmentally disabled, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, university and college students, drug offenders, victim of crimes and general public. Over 800 persons.

he existing building does not meet the requirements of having a hardened facility nor does it meet the required standards for NFPA 1500 (wellness center, storage and sanitation of personal protection equipment); and, NFPA 13 (fire sprinklers and fire flow). A completed hardened structure to house first responders and safe environment for personnel and first responders.

This facility will be able to provide a traiing facility for both fire and police along with being a training facility to neighboring agencies. The facility will also allow for public education programs from school age to elderly citizens (i.e., CPR, fire extinguisher and firearm safety trainings, etc). Requiring expanded higher education in the field could improve the public's perception of the fire and police services as well as help push for the professionalize of these services.
