12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Construction of this facility will satisfy many of the City's parks and recreation facility and programming needs priorities as ranked by the statistically valid surveys conducted during the City of Port St. Lucie Parks & Recreation 10-Year master Plan development and correlates heavily with the annual Citizen Survey requested amenities and activities. Tradition Regional Park will increase access to an under-served area of the City and increase the LOS (level of service) for park and recreation amenities in this demonstrated recreation facility deficient area of the City.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities and services to be provided and the intended purpose of the funds are to increase recreational opportunities for this area of the City. The funds will be used to construct four baseball fields, four softball fields, three soccer/multipurpose fields along with ancillary support facilities such as parking, restrooms and lighting.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services to be provided are adult and youth sports programs that will increase overall health and well-being for City residents and families.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is all residents in this region. As a regional park it has the potential to serve over 200,000 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

The expected outcome of the project would be increase recreational level of service for the community. The City of Port St. Lucie continually seeks public input via surveys to gauge livability and satisfaction of services provided.

Cancellation of contract and funding reimbursement.
