12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Expanding broadband access to all municipal facilities in the Village of North Palm Beach and bring free high-speed public Wi-Fi to all local buildings and parks. This would enhance local government services in the village, increase visitation to outdoor areas (to help get people into nature), and provide a safety net to school-aged children, job seekers, and disadvantaged groups. Currently, none of the local parks and recreation facilities have any public Internet access.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Complete installation of village-owned fiber to remaining local facilities. Three facilities have already been completed (Public Safety, Village Hall, and the Library). What remains are three parks and recreation facilities, Public Works, the tennis center, and the newly dedicated emergency operations center. At these facilities, the public will then gain improved government services and Wi-Fi.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Free high-speed public Wi-Fi. More Internet access points across the village. Wi-Fi at all village-owned facilities and parks. Better customer service. More venues for educational programs and classes. More venues for homework help and school-aged students. More venues for job seekers and homeless folks to access the Internet.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless persons, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, and university/college students. In excess of 3,000 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Free high-speed public Wi-Fi. More Internet access points across the village. Wi-Fi at all village-owned facilities and parks. More venues for educational programs and classes. More venues for homework help and school-aged students. More venues for job seekers and homeless folks to access the Internet. Public Wi-Fi access has a huge impact on tourism. When traveling, people want to stay in contact with their inner social circle, share photos and video on their social media networks, and check travel information. Consequently, tourists are more incentivized to travel to a location if they can use the internet for free. Remote workers, gig workers, and tutors would all be able to utilize Wi-Fi for free and save money at home. With additional connectivity, more program venues open up to host new classes, programs, and events. Classes that need Internet connections would now be possible at multiple locations throughout the village.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the Village of North Palm Beach does not perform and install the broadband as agreed, it will return all funds appropriated to it for this purpose.
