Florida's VR Program conducts a three year needs assessment to determine the gaps between existing resources, capacity, and outcomes and those that are required to bring about th highest levels of employment for Floridians with disabilities. As the DSO to the state VR program, The Able Trust will provide maximum supports to assist VR in closing the gaps and ensuring Floridians with disabilities have the most opportunity for full employment. Able Inclusion Florida is a three-year plan to provide analysis of existing data and residentify new areas of research, test hypotheses for solutions, develop more partners/funders, and most importantly provide the necessary resources and supports to the state VR system to fully realize our shared mission of employment for Floridians with disabilities.

As the Direct Support Organization to the state VR agency and in conjunction with the VR 3-year comprehensive needs assessment, conduct data analysis, stakeholder input, partner recruitment, and solution development all of which will lead to closing the workforce participation gap of Floridians with disabilities by 2030.

- 1. Design & implement supports for the VR system (state staff, contracted providers, businesses, education providers) to adopt, use, and sustain effective solutions to common workforce challenges of Floridians with disabilities.
- 2. Provide high-quality content and resources for the VR system that is based on current research and evidence-based practice.
- 3. Leverage technology to disseminate resources and ensure that every solution is cost-effective and scalable.
- 4. Forge the partnerships needed to effectively create, deploy, and institutionalize system/policy changes which result in closing the workforce participation gap.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

- 1. Capacity building and professional development of VR staff, community employment service contractors, and other disability workforce development professionals.
- 2. Direct support of- and a talent pipeline for- Florida businesses.
- 3. Direct support and business connections for post-secondary institutions which result in an increase of the workforce attainment rate for students with disabilities in Florida.
- 4. A collaborative of Florida leaders committed to ongoing innovation and systems/policy change which positively affects the workforce participation rate of people with disabilities.

Closing Florida's workforce participation gap for people with disabilities by 2030 (current gap between people with disabilities and the general population is 45%). Measured by annual economic data including VR employment outcomes.
