12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The goal of the Readers Lab is to ensure early learners to 5th grades have a strong foundation that prepares students for academic achievement in Reading, numeracy, and social-emotional skills in school. The reader lab focused on teaching students literacy skills, including Reading, math, and writing. The reader lab wants to demonstrate that many students will learn to read when the correct strategies are in place, and the environment is conducive to learning.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities and services provided: direct instruction by reading instructors, kinesthetic learning, building reading and writing portfolios, and mastering five elements of reading: phoneme, phonics, word development, spelling, and comprehension. Math activities: math games that teach students to understand numbers and sequences of numbers, social, emotional activities: zone of regulation helps students understand their emotions and teaches regulation and deescalation strategies. Students will have informal assessments throughout the year to ensure academic growth is in progress, and school readiness is present.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will receive direct services provided by the appropriation project. The activities and services provided: direct instruction by reading instructor, kinesthetic learning, building reading and writing portfolios, and mastering five elements of reading: phoneme, phonics, word development, spelling, and comprehension. Math activities: math games that teach students to understand numbers and sequences of numbers social, emotional activities: zone of regulation helps students understand their emotions and teaches regulation and de-escalation strategies. Students will have informal assessments throughout the year to ensure academic growth is in progress, and school readiness is present. As enrichment activities student will be exposed to Art, understanding shapes and lines and learning sustainable skills through gardening.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

A three-year pilot program. The reader lab after-school system plan to provide literacy service to 60 students during after school and summer Reading Lab 120 students. Eventually, the reader lab will become a replicated model throughout the county to teach reading to struggling students trapped in low-performing schools.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The methodology to measure student success by portfolios with samples of reading, math, and writing activities, drawing, and paintings, assessments scores in reading, math, writing, art, and gardening.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The second-year penalty should be imposed during the third year by monthly draw-downs. The punishment should be suspended during the summer reading lab due to a more extensive program.
