12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

By initiating the expansion of mental health support groups focused on psycho-education, we expect to see an overall improvement in the mental health, independence, and relationships of our veterans. We also believe that our veterans will see a significant decrease in suicidal ideation and behaviors, negative alterations, and overall symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

With the funding of this initiative, we will be offering additional group and individual counseling sessions for our veterans and their immediate family members.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

With the funding of this initiative, we will be offering additional group and individual counseling sessions for our veterans and their immediate family members.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

With over 1.5 Million veterans calling Florida home, many of whom reside in the Greater Tampa Bay area, we are focused on being able to serve more veterans through our program. The target population is veterans and their immediate family members who are actively involved in our program. We can expect approximately 1000 individuals from across the state of Florida to be positively impacted by this initiative.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

The expected benefit or outcome of this project is an overall improvement in the mental health, independence, and relationships of our veterans. We also believe our veterans will see a greater decrease in suicidal ideation and behaviors, negative alterations, and a decrease in overall Post Traumatic Stress Disorder symptoms. The methodology in which this outcome will be measured is through our pre and post analysis that is currently conducted at the start of the program, at the end of the program, 1 month, 3 month, and 6 months after the completion of the program. This assessment is a combination of the PTSD checklist for DSM-5 (PCL-5), PSI, QUIDS-SR, PANSI, ECR-RS, AUDIT-C, and Connor-Davidson Resiliency Scale. K9 Partners for Patriots in collaboration with researchers at the University of Central Florida shifted to an Online Qualtrics assessment tool July 2020 to fully gauge participant's outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The suggested penalties that may occur for failing to meet deliverables would be the lack of being able to provide and expand the mental health services that we offer.
