HCSO received \$290,266.90 in Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF)which was used to expand video court capabilities to limit the spread of COVID-19, for PPE, and for cleaning, disinfecting, and sanitizing workspaces. CARES Act funds (\$2.3M) were used to increase HCSO's capabilities for producing remote learning, for modifying workspaces to allow personnel to work at safer distances, for PPE, and for cleaning, disinfecting, and sanitizing areas.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) will enhance their capabilities in training K9/handler teams in the areas of patrol (including officer protection, suspect apprehension, area or building clearance, etc.), detection (finding narcotics or explosives), and tracking missing/endangered persons by constructing a dedicated facility for training and safely boarding K9s.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

HCSO will prepare the site and construct the facility in order to provide a conducive environment in which to train K9/handler teams. This facility will also allow HCSO to provide training for other agencies' K9s and handlers from throughout the State of Florida. HCSO will instruct FDLE certified patrol K9 schools for new K9 teams (480 hours course) and train K9/handler teams to enhance the training of their existing K9s and handlers in the areas of patrol (including officer protection, suspect apprehension, area or building clearance, etc.), detection (finding narcotics or explosives), and tracking missing/endangered persons.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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HCSO K9s and K9 handlers will respond to calls for service with the most up-to-date training and will be able to reinforce their skills at a dedicated facility in order to best respond to incidents requiring them to assist in tracking missing/endangered persons, detecting narcotics or explosives, or apprehending suspects. HCSO will also be able to continue to provide training to other agencies' K9/handler teams so those jurisdictions will be able to provide these services to their citizens.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will serve the population of Hillsborough County as well as all tourists and visitors to the area. The project will also have an impact on the citizens of all of the jurisdictions whose K9/handler teams receive training from HCSO. The population of Hillsborough County is approximately 1.478 million and millions of tourists visit annually. The HCSO Canine Section was deployed 1299 times from November 1, 2020 to November 1, 2021, including requests to respond to assist seven (7) other law enforcement agencies.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The HCSO Canine Section will be able to host more training courses and larger trainings, including large-scale K9 events. HCSO will be able to provide records for training courses conducted. HCSO can also provide historical training information to compare the number of courses and number of attendees trained prior to construction of the proposed facility with the number of courses and number of attendees trained after completion of the proposed facility.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
