12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funding will support implementation of the Pensacola Bay Oyster Fisheries and Habitat Management Plan by providing seed funding to plan and design a multi-tiered bay-scale oyster restoration project in East, Blackwater, Escambia, and Pensacola Bays. The Estuary Program, in partnership with The Nature Conservancy, will then seek implementation funding from other sources with a goal to restore a sustainable oyster industry in the community. This project also supports the Estuary Program Community Grant Program, which annually funds suite of projects benefiting water quality, habitat restoration, fisheries enhancements, citizen science, and coastal resilience activities throughout the Pensacola and Perdido Bay Systems.

This funding request supports Executive Order 19-12, Achieving More Now for Florida's Environment, as signed by Governor DeSantis on January 10, 2019 through the implementation of water quality improvements, oyster habitat restoration, and coastal resilience enhancement

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Detailed specifications and plans for oyster restoration in East, Blackwater, Escambia, and Pensacola Bays; enhanced water quality monitoring in the Pensacola and Perdido Bay watersheds; improvement in water quality through reduction of bacteria, nutrients, algae blooms, and/or total suspended solids entering surface waters in the Pensacola and Perdido Bay watersheds; and community engagement through the Estuary Program's education and outreach activities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Implementation of the Pensacola Bay Oyster Fisheries and Habitat Management Plan by establishing the foundation for the restoration of a sustainable oyster industry in the community. Water quality monitoring, analysis and reporting to identify and prioritize root causes of nutrients, bacteria, and algae blooms in waterways, to decrease response time to bathing beach water quality issues, and to help implement priorities in the Estuary Program Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan.

Implementation of water quality improvement pilot projects as identified by the Pensacola and Perdido Bays Estuary Program Community Grant Program. Example projects include oyster restoration, living shorelines, stormwater treatment through green infrastructure retrofits, and education/outreach activities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population is the citizens of the Pensacola and Perdido Bay watersheds and all visitors to the area. 315,000 residents and 2.2 million visitors are expected to be served through water quality monitoring, water quality improvement pilot projects, education/outreach activities, and the restoration of a sustainable oyster fishery associated with this funding request.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Funding will allow the Estuary Program to develop a shovel ready multi-tiered bay-scale oyster restoration project to support a sustainable oyster fishery in the community.

Water quality will be improved as measured by monitoring of sites where water quality hard and soft infrastructure improvements are made.

Health of beach visitors will be aided as measured by the increase in the number of water quality samples and increased number of opportunities to inform the public of the water quality.

Better water quality from this project and related estuary program water quality improvement initiatives are expected to improve economic opportunity and tourism as measured by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity and Tourist Development Councils.

Outreach to residents and visitors will enhance awareness, preservation, and recreational use of the State's coastal resources.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Funding is proposed to be a reimbursement agreement with required deliverables. Failure to achieve deliverables will result in denial of related reimbursement requests.
