4. Project/Program Description

The Skills Center is building a state-of-the-art facility in east Tampa's minority community. Developed using the existing shell of a historic skating rink, the new 55,000 square foot facility will use the Skills Center's proven model of sports-based youth development to build a future for many of Tampa's struggling youth. Facility features will provide the local community with safe, quality activity and education spaces, health promotion, venue for special events, technology access and training, co-working space, and more than 100 new job opportunities. Especially unique to the project is the intentional collaboration with four key Black-led nonprofits who will share space in the facility. Each partner will deliver their own specialized services in concert with the core Skills Center services to amplify the overall success for young people.

**12. Program Performance**

**a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?**

Using a collaborative approach built on a proven model from the U.S. Department of Labor, Youth Opportunity Movement, the Skills Center will create equity in education, health, and workforce readiness for young people, especially the east Tampa community; build a strategic alliance between five Black-led nonprofit organizations to leverage resources, programming, funding, and impact; and sign a social enterprise venture that provides sustainability.

Once fully completed, the new facilities will include a job training/education room, a health and nutrition demonstration kitchen, gymnasium, multipurpose areas, co-working offices, and event space. Serving 3,500 youth, and produce an economic impact of more than \$25 million in east Tampa over the next five years. The requested funds will assist in the facility's construction and initial operation.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**



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All youth will receive a single intake and enrollment process, individual educational plan (IEP) that determines and directs the student's participation in the program, and case management services to guide youth through the program coordinating supportive services and evaluating each student's progress. Trained sports coaches will intentionally incorporate these activities to address the identified needs of each youth. In addition, the Academic Café, a state of the art collaborative learning environment, will allow students to participate in educational programs that positively support academic success. The Café will have interactive-learning zones that encompass both collaborative group and independent work areas offered in person and virtually. Services would include tutoring, homework assistance, GED prep, and ACT/SAT prep. The Café will empower parents through workshops that provide information on how to advocate and support their children from middle to high school.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

In addition to the core sports-based youth development services, the Skills Center will bring other needed services to citizens in east Tampa, Hillsborough County, and the Tampa Bay area. The facility will offer venue space for sports and wellness activities and family and community gatherings. The Esports arena is a resource to all who want to learn and compete with peers in their community and across the globe. Esports provides students with hands-on training in broadcast production, online streaming, audio engineering, video editing, and game development. There is "co-work" space for local business and a teaching kitchen for promoting health and nutrition. Agreements are being forged with local charter schools, senior groups, and others to use the facility during non-sports hours to maximize community opportunity.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

Services will be open to youth living throughout Hillsborough County. However, youth living in zip codes 33603, 33604, 33605, 33610, and 33612 are the targeted population. There are four specific groups of students: Pre-K to elementary, middle school, high school, and young adults. Younger youth will have the opportunity to participate in limited programming. The intent is to build a strong academic foundation, create healthy habits, and promote life skills through access to sports and programming for middle and high school youth. There is an emerging need to support young people at critical transition points like middle to high school and high school to young adult as they experience physical, emotional, cognitive, and social development as stated in the Engaging Older Youth (2010) Harvard Family Research Project. At least 3,500 youth annually.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

The Skills Center's new facility will permit youth and families to establish long-term meaningful involvement that will result in the following short-term benchmarks: 95% of students have on time grade promotion, 85% have increased educational aspirations, 80% have positive child to parent/adult relationships, 75% demonstrate improved social behaviors, and 85% of parents are involved with their child's development/education. These benchmarks will lead to OUTCOMES of: Education - 85% attain a high school diploma; Health - 80% achieve optimal health; and Employment - 80% enter college, employment, a vocation, or the military. The IMPACT is long-term employment and increased earnings; reduced poverty, increased tax generation, and decreased cost for health care, substance abuse and incarceration. The Skills Center has secured a proven participant enrollment, tracking, and reporting system from the Red Wing Foundation courtesy of the relationship with the Toronto Raptors.

**f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?**

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
