The project will require engineering design, construction, and construction inspection services.

Citizens will be provided with a safer intersection configuration at US 301 and Crawford Road by providing separate freight vehicles lanes specifically for acceleration and deceleration outside the through traffic lanes. Residents also benefit from additional tax that serves to improve roads, create parks, and provide additional government services.

This project benefits all 80,000 residents of Nassau County.
