a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Opa-Locka Redevelopment Plan needs to be amended to 1] extend the lifespan of the OCRA from ending in October 2033 to October 2039, 2] add new projects and programs to address and remove slum and blight, and 3] adjust the boundaries of the OCRA. The expansion of the OCRA boundaries will require a new Finding of Necessity [FON] to address the new areas to be added to the OCRA.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

An updated CRA Plan seeks to add new projects and programs to address and remove slum and blight and adjust the boundaries of the OCRA to include both sides of NW 22 Avenue from SR-9 to NW Opa-Locka Boulevard, 27th Avenue from SR-9 to NW 135th Street, and potentially to include the Opa-Locka Flea Market site.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Increased tax revenue with increased size adds new projects and programs to address and remove slum and blight.
