The total number of pages to be printed is approximately 7,288 pages. This amounts to 1 1/2 cases of paper at an estimated expense of \$37.50 plus printing per page of approximately .01 cent per page for a total of \$72.88 to print. This amounts to a grand total of \$110.38 per student.	11,038

Citizens High School is a fully accredited high school with a program designed to provide a full high school diploma, not a GED. Florida Cares has developed a program that is tailored to incarcerated students who lack the necessary technology requirements due to incarceration by offering a correspondence off line program where Florida Cares Charity Corp. will print course materials, proctor exams, and facilitate a graduation in partnership with Citizens High School which is recognized by the Florida Department of Education and includes subject-matter experts and state-certified faculty members assigned for assistance.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

Citizens who volunteer with Florida Cares will facilitate the program by serving as a conduit between the incarcerated individual and CHS by delivering course materials to incarcerated individuals, proctoring midterm exams, proctoring final exams and hosting graduation ceremonies.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**



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People incarcerated within the Florida Department of Corrections. According to FDC there are currently approximately 53,000 incarcerated people who do not have a high school education or GED of which approximately 52,000 are over the age of 21. Florida Cares seeks to educate this portion of the incarcerated to decrease violence while incarcerated and increase their chances of employability upon release thus reducing recidivism.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

FDC along with numerous voters and legislators have spoken before the legislature on the need to educate incarcerated individuals. Additionally, studies show incarcerated people who participate in correctional education programs had a 43% lower recidivism rate than those who did not. See study by Rand Corporation.
