12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To establish a statewide parent leadership network of advisory councils in each jurisdiction across the state to strengthen, link and connect parents and caregivers in need of support who are at risk of child welfare system involvement with peer leaders with lived experience in child welfare to promote growth and leadership opportunities through council involvement.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

To incubate and install parent leadership advisory councils with the intent to elevate and embed parent voice, leadership, presence, and expertise in each jurisdiction across the state. The FCC will spearhead, coordinate, support and implement the statewide parent leadership advisory councils during the early adoption phase of implementation with the intent of spinning the entities off as freestanding parent-run organizations in the future. The FCC will provide seed funding, training, and technical assistance to local communities to support the development and installation of councils. The FCC using alternative funds will recruit and hire a State Parent Leadership Coordinator who will support the development, growth, and sustainability of parent leadership councils and lead and mobilize the FCC statewide council. c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Leadership development and training, access to and participation in local parent leadership advisory councils and related events, system navigation, community connections to informal resources and peer support.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is individuals and parents with lived experience in child welfare. We expect to serve a minimum of 250 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Research shows access to services, voice in the process and ownership of the plan produces positive outcomes. Yet, parent engagement and inclusion in child welfare decision making is greatly lacking. The Families First Prevention Services Act and shift in child welfare funding and practice moving upstream to reach and serve families at home and in their communities requires a change in the traditional child welfare culture and environment. One that respects, values and includes parent voice to inform system professionals and policy makers of how best to serve families in need of support to prevent entry into care when viable alternatives exist. Bringing parents to the table to be trained and included in policy and practice will produce a more efficient and effective safety net, reduce costs and the number of families entering and reentering care and result in the establishment of a community based network that is informed and validated as effective by those with lived experience.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Withhold reimbursement of State funding.
