12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The establishment of an accredited Early Learning Education Center Demonstration Project will address the unmet needs of the area's children by better preparing them to enter school ready and be equipped to be successful in school, extracurricular activities, and their roles in the workforce. The Center will expand the access to high-quality early education programs that includes a two-generational approach and offers comprehensive professional development opportunities to early education providers throughout the Big Bend. By providing training and technical assistance to early learning educators, the project will expand the availability of a highly trained workforce of early education professionals.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project entails the provision of full-time, year-round high-quality services including highly trained and accredited staff, an education focused environment, state of the art facilities, research-backed and developmentally appropriate curriculum, and high-quality materials. The high quality training component will focus on addressing the shortage of early learning providers and workforce shortages in the industry.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Young children will benefit from the Center's highly trained full-time staff, education focused environment, and developmentally appropriate curriculum. Parents will benefit from educational resources focused on nutrition and wellness, parenting skills, and a strong network of social services and counseling. Students will benefit from the head start they receive as a young child that focuses on developing educational skills and preparing them to success in a school setting; students can carry and improve upon these skills throughout their entire educational career. The workforce will benefit from the Center because employees will enter their careers with a successful educational experience and a range of skills required to provide high quality early education and address workforce needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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The target population of this project is the residents of South City and Tallahassee's Southside. At least 3,000 people can expect to be served by this project. Additionally, through the training aspect of the Center, providers from throughout the Big Bend region will have access for training on the provision of high quality early learning services.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

In the short term, the goal is to ensure that all participating children are socio-emotionally and academically ready for kindergarten and that their families are engaged in the process. In the long term, the goal is to break the cycle of poverty in the community by promoting college and career readiness and decreased incarceration rates among participating children comparable to similar demographics. This will be measured by long-term increases in area kindergarten readiness levels, unemployment rates, and incarceration rates. Additionally, through the training and professional/workforce development aspects of the demonstration project, an increase in the number and quality of early education professionals is expected.
