a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Our evidence-based solution resolves failed reentry by helping individuals to understand the importance of investing in themselves by building valuable skills and improving their personal road maps to opening a small business, or jump starting their careers through education in soft skills, thus reducing interpersonal conflict, and empowering them to lead non violent lives.

Repayment of funds to the state

The methodology used to evaluate these benefits will be a hybrid quantitative cost-benefit analysis that tracks total enrollment in the program, the re-incarceration rates of program enrollees, the re-incarceration rate of participants who complete the program, the employability rate of participants who complete the program, and the number of businesses created by participants who complete the program.
