The expansion of the water distribution system into this area will take residents off of their potable drinking well systems. Thus, relieving the Florida Aquifer of associated demand. The proposed sewer collection system expansion will allow local septic tanks to be taken offline resulting in increased water quality in local waterways.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Expansion of the City's sewer collection system and drinking water system in the Kings Bayou and Pretty Bayou areas. Activities include planning, engineering and permitting required for the expansion.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Available connection to municipal water/sewer systems.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents of Kings Bayou and Pretty Bayou areas.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefits or outcomes for the water system include the removal of wells which will relieve demands from the Florida Aquifer. For the sewer system, septic tanks will go offline and local waterways will see reduced bacteria contamination. The local bodies of water experience contamination due to the nearby septic tanks leeching into the waterways. With the removal of septic tanks, water quality will improve. Expansion will create engineering and inspection jobs. Methodology for measuring outcomes includes sampling and lab testing and surveying the companies working on the project.
