12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The third phase of the Florida Agriculture Center & Horse Park Authority (FACHPA) will continue to improve the infrastructure, increasing the disaster relief footprint and expanding on the variety of events hosted at the park. FACHPA has proven to be a vital site in times of disaster relief, not only as an animal-safe evacuation site, but as a staging point of distribution for food, water and supplies. The FACHPA was also instrumental in the distribution of the COVID-9 vaccination and testing.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities include: educational, recreational, agricultural, and emergency management. Examples include (but not limited to) equine competitions, youth rodeos, cross country and athletic events, compost research, historic event re-enactments, car shows, Christmas light displays, polo matches, and K9 displays and training.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services for citizens include (but are not limited to) recreation, safety, housing, emergency management, and education.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, developmentally disabled, physically disabled, grade school students, high school students, university/college students, and general population (The majority of funds will benefit no specific group). Other: Hurricane and Emergency evacuation for humans and livestock, staging and point of distribution. Last year the Horse Park hosted more than 150,000 visitors and only expects to see those numbers increase.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Improve physical health - Measure: The FACHPA has events throughout the year promoting physical fitness. Some of these include: high school cross country races, bicycle races, trail running, and duathlons. Methodology: Increasing the number of events will promote the benefits of health and fitness throughout the community and state.

Improve Mental Health - Measure: The FACHPA is a host for many equine events including several that serve students. Research shows the therapeutic value of horses for people of all ages, particularly those engaged in a sport as a discipline. Methodology: Increasing the number of events will promote the health and fitness of the community and event participants.

Enrich cultural experience - Measure: The FACHPA hosts educational events such as the Ocklawaha River Raid Civil War Reenactment which portrays the 1865 skirmish in Marion County. Methodology: Historic event reenactments educate citizens and visitors of all ages on the history of Florida.

Failure to meet deliverables would result in financial consequences including withholding of funding, or reduction in specified payments.
