12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Kings Bay Riverwalk is a near one-mile meandering paved trail, over and near the water, that showcases Crystal River's natural beauty while protecting the State's \$25 million investment in restoring the bay. Once this final 25% is constructed, all Florida residents and nearly 350,000 documented tourists can utilize the Riverwalk to view the bay's offerings, including the abundant West Indian Manatee, recently restored seagrasses, numerous restaurants, and shops that will be interconnected.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The State of Florida has invested about \$25 million in restoring Kings Bay by replacing native eelgrass and eliminating the noxious lygbia that had been choking the bay. Much of the Riverwalk will provide an opportunity for the public to enjoy the bay and the restored areas without a boat. Boats have been proven to irreparably damage the eelgrass.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Crystal River is the host to nearly 350,000 tourists coming from across the globe. A majority of them visit, enjoy the natural offerings, and go home without staying overnight. Along with being a destination itself, the Riverwalk will provide an extra "activity" for many current visitors and potentially keep them overnight. The Citrus County TDC found this true and is a major funding partner.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Crystal River is the host to nearly 350,000 tourists coming from across the globe in addition to the many residents of the city and county.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?
