12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Through Community Coaches for HIV Prevention, A Leap of Faith Foundation seeks to enhance its delivery of effective HIV prevention services within Black and Brown communities in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties. To accomplish this purpose, A Leap of Faith will employ community health workers (from among economically distressed Black and Brown community members) to reduce new HIV infections, transmissions, and diagnoses. A Leap of Faith will recruit, train, and supervise community health workers from within vulnerable communities. Employed community health workers will utilize a neighborhood approach to service provision, literally taking programming to the streets and delivering HIV education and prevention support face-to-face with individuals in at-risk and marginalized Black and Brown communities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Project services will be provided by community health workers who spend extensive time listening, understanding, relationship building, and responding in a relevant and meaningful manner through a trustworthy alliance and in partnership with the target population. Focusing on both risk and protective factors, HIV prevention education will address unhealthy attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors as well as precautions and increased access to accurate and reliable health information and support. Project community health workers will frequently connect individuals and families to local health centers for testing, examination, and ongoing care. Without this intervention, many would remain disconnected from wellness services and resources. In addition, a number of community events will be hosted to reach significant numbers of at-risk Black and Brown individuals and families at one time.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Through Community Coaches for HIV Prevention, community health workers will be the frontline change agents to reduce health disparities in underserved populations. They will offer individualized HIV-related education and supportive counseling, distribute condoms, and connect individuals with HIV-specific healthcare services and resources. They will follow-up with the individuals served to determine their HIV status and healthcare practices. Community health workers will provide culturally appropriate and trusted health education and information, help people get the care they need, give informal counseling and guidance on health behaviors and advocate for individual and community health needs. Since they typically reside in the community they serve, community health workers have the unique ability to bring information where it is needed most. They can reach community residents where they live, eat, play, work, and worship.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Community Coaches for HIV Prevention will effectively address and prevent HIV/AIDS in Black and Brown communities (particularly low income persons ages 16 to 80 of all gender identities and sexual orientations) in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties. A Leap of Faith Foundation intends to reach 800 individuals with this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Community Coaches for HIV prevention will contribute to the reduction of HIV transmission within the Black and Brown communities of Miami-Dade and Broward Counties. 85% of individuals served will maintain HIV negative status, thereby reducing the Black and Brown HIV infection in Southeast Florida. Project performance and outcome will be measured through baseline and follow-up HIV testing. Individuals served by Community Coaches for HIV Prevention will also be surveyed regarding project satisfaction and benefit following service delivery.
