12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Support for Student Scholarships to be used for attracting and retaining highly qualified Florida residents at UF's College of Law, thus enabling more students to graduate with less debt and to pursue jobs of their choice without overly relying on the amount of starting salaries. For example, lower debt upon graduation allows students to pursue jobs as Assistant State Attorneys and Assistant Public Defenders throughout the State of Florida.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The \$3.2 M in non-recurring state funds will be matched with a like amount from university funds, thus creating a total of \$6.4M to support Student Scholarships. This request will enable UF Law to continue to attract highly qualified in-state students and to ensure they graduate with manageable debt, thereby permitting them to pursue the jobs of their choice after graduation without overly relying on the amount of starting salaries.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Financial aid for highly qualified in-state students who attend UF Law.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

UF College of Law students, 201-400

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Improve the quality of education through the Recruitment and Retention of highly-qualified Florida residents for the Levin College of Law; Average LSAT scores; First Time Passage Rates for the Florida Bar; UF National Ranking among Top 5 Public Law Schools in the country. UF will closely monitor the relationship between financial aid, entering student credentials, job outcomes, and average indebtedness at graduation and student success upon graduation.
