a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To provide YMCA Youth in Government students the opportunity to be designated USF St. Petersburg (USFSP) Citizen Scholars. The students will participate in academic activities and receive instruction by USFSP Faculty and receive six undergraduate credit hours upon satisfactory completion.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Classroom instruction by college level instructors, lectured by elected and appointed officials, field experiences around the delivery of services by local, state, and federal agencies as well as social service and quasi-governmental agencies.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Civics Education Instruction.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, high school students & university/college students. There is expected to be between 100-200 individuals served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

1) Improved mental health: satisfaction and sense of accomplishment that comes with mastery of a subject and having a college classroom experience. 2) Enrich cultural experience: participants visit a variety of museums and have guest lectures on the cultural and historical events and their relations to the current civics climate. Measured by the completion of capstone project and passage of final exam at Summer Civics Institute. (3) Improve quality of education: high school level participants will gain a heightened understanding and knowledge of Florida government and leadership through college level curriculum presented throughout the program. Measured by completion of capstone project and passage of final exam of Summer Civics Institute.
