### 12. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

A full-service, awe-inspiring entrance experience is both critical for setting the tone for our guests' visit as well as for the financial health of the Zoo. On average, more than 70 percent of operating revenue is generated at the entrance; therefore with increased visitors to the manatee experience, JZG will be able to educate more Floridians on how to better protect manatees and conserve their habitats. An engaging and thought-provoking arrival experience has proven to be a successful business strategy for other zoos and aquariums, and increased revenues translates directly to increased conservation support.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The new Manatee Gateway will create a more efficient, productive and satisfying and informed guest experience, ushering in Floridians to to the Manatee River habitat that will be used in the progressive rehabilitation of injured and orphaned manatees in the Northeast Florida region who were rescued and transported to our Manatee Critical Care Center (MCCC). Following medical treatment, the manatees will be housed in the Manatee River habitat to convalesce and recover for release back to the wild. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and the US Fish and Wildlife Service fully support JZG's additional capacity to save and protect one of Florida's most iconic heritage species and unique cultural treasures—the manatee.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Citizens will be taught about the Zoo's critical regional role it plays in conservation and preservation efforts for the injured and orphaned manatees. Additionally, citizens will be educated on how to save and protect one of Florida's most iconic heritage species and unique cultural treasures—the manatee. Some main learning goals include: the legal protection of the manatee as an endangered species, their environment of freshwater, brackish, and saltwater habitats; food sources including vegetation and seagrass; and most importantly was actions these visitors can take to save the manatees now that they are educated and the experience has caused the visitors to care about these Florida treasures.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All Zoo visitors are expected to be served which include elderly, persons with poor mental and physical health, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth (especially through field trips with local schools), developmentally disabled, preschool students, and grade/high/college school students. Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens is the premier conservation and education family destination for North Florida with more than 1 million visits annually and growing.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The outcome of the project is an entrance for the Manatee River Experience that will draw visitors in as a gateway experience at at the Zoo. This experience will educate visitors and the ultimate goal is that more of Florida's manatees are protected, cared for, and saved. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and the US Fish and Wildlife Service fully support JZG's additional capacity to save and protect one of Florida's most iconic heritage species and unique cultural treasures—the manatee.
