a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Special economic rural opportunity zone for the improvements to public safety and security. Runway improvements, adding on-site refueling capability, and increasing hangar space will significantly improve airport's capacity for supporting general aviation; serving as the emergency management staging base for the Division of Emergency Management for disaster response for central and south Florida; and supporting DOD activities at the Avon Park bombing range.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

General aviation service, military support training, disaster relief, rural energy bio mass project, cargo, and transportation.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Fixed based operations, agricultural, energy, emergency management, and DOD training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents of Avon Park as well as southwest Florida during statewide emergencies. 5,000 people daily as well as over 1 million during statewide disasters.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Job creation and economic growth for targeted industries such as manufacturing, agricultural, logistics, aviation, and emergency management.
